Lady Bird Johnson—wife, mother, grandmother, conservationist, businesswoman, philanthropist and First Lady—died July 11, 2007, at 4:18 p.m., at her home in Austin, TX, at the age of 94.

Mrs. Johnson was preceded in death by her husband, President Lyndon Baines Johnson, who died in 1973. She is survived by her children—Lynda, and her husband Charles Robb, and Luci Baines Johnson, and her husband Ian Turpin—as well as seven grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren.
