SEQUENCE OF EVENTS:

1. As the motorcade arrives, the officer in charge will bring the ceremonial troops to attention. The family is escorted to their positions.
2. Extended family, combined choir and Library officials are positioned inside the library. Immediate family will exit the motorcade. The Armed Forces Body Bearers will remove the casket from the hearse and then carry the remains across the plaza. A bagpiper will lead followed by the family minister, and the remains and the immediate family.
3. The bagpiper will remain outside and the family and casket will proceed inside library.
4. The casket will be placed on a church truck, flowers will be removed from the casket and it will be moved into the Great Hall to the base of the stairs.
5. The casket team will carry the remains up the Grand Staircase with the immediate family following.
6. Once placed on bier, the ceremonial troops will depart, the minister and Mrs Johnson's daughters will place the pall on the casket.
7. The family and minister will join hands say *The Lord's Prayer*.
8. Once family members depart, the public may file past the casket and pay their respects. There may be times when the public may be asked to permit the family private time throughout the repose.
